Notes to the editors

1. The POWER - Pushing Offshore Wind Energy Regions initiative creates a North Sea competence network for offshore wind energy. The project assesses environmental and planning as well as acceptance issues of offshore wind farms, supports the development of a reliable regional supply chain for the sector, and elaborates skills development measures. The project brings together 37 organisations from five countries around the North Sea. It is co-financed by the Interreg IIIB North Sea Programme. Suffolk County Council leads the UK element of the project, working closely on the project with its regional partners East of England Energy Group (EEEGr), Waveney District Council and Renewables East. The Celebrate Awards are being hosted by the East of England Development Agency (EEDA), the Government Office for the East of England (Go East) and the East of England Regional Assembly (EERA) who are jointly responsible for the delivery of European Structural Funds in the region. POWER has been shortlisted in the “Environmental Impact Award” category. The winners will be announced in a ceremony on 5 October 2006.
